



Job Title: Lower School Math/Science Teacher

Primary responsibilities will be in planning and teaching math content and skills following Steamboat Mountain School's math curriculum. The LS teacher will report directly to the Head of School and will be responsible for developing curriculum, designing lessons, and engaging students in high-quality learning. The ideal candidate has at least five years of experience teaching mathematics and science to elementary-aged students. Candidates should be familiar with differentiated instruction so that each child has the opportunity to do work that is appropriately challenging. Further, interested applicants should be knowledgeable in the field of mathematics, passionate about working with children, and have experience with project-based learning.

- Create units and lesson plans that prioritize student engagement and individual needs using student-centered, inquiry-based approaches.
- Prepare lessons and develop curricula that will engage students while employing a variety of teaching methods and differentiated instruction to engage a range of learners.
- Maintain accurate records of student growth and communicate progress with families.
- Create a classroom culture that is engaging, student-centered, and effectively managed.
- Engage in regular supervisory duties including recess.
- Attend faculty meetings and professional development days.
- Maintain professional competence through in-service education activities provided by the school and through self-selected professional growth activities.
